- ▶ Assignments and projects should be submitted on time.

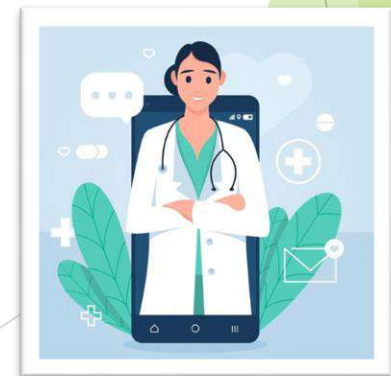


IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- ▶ Internal assessments carry a lot of weightage.
- ▶ In order to be declared pass, a student must secure 33% marks in each of the subjects and in aggregate.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- ▶ In case a student is absent due to ill health during examination, the parents should give a written application to the Principal citing the reason for the absence .
- ▶ This must be followed by a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner within 3 days.





IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- ▶ Inform the class teacher and Admin Office immediately in case of a change in your address and telephone numbers.
